blossoms.










Alexander Calder and I

We created imaginary forms by repurposing what we found in nature into a sculpture.








Natural Painting

Using natural colours derived from ingredients found in our school's kitchen, we painted our own compositions








Recycled Flowers

Painting Flowers


After observing real flowers and their parts and colours, we painted our own renditions. These are our flowers.

We mixed colours to create unique skin colours for these faces. What a beautiful and diverse world. We are different, yet we are the same.






The Magic of Colours
